GOOD NEIGHBOUR POLICY

The role of commercial organisations within the community is changing. When CS Recycling was founded in 1937, there were few formal requirements directing the company with regards to its neighbours over and above the natural desire to do the right thing. As a result, CS Recycling went about its business quietly while living alongside its residential and commercial neighbours.

CS Recycling first moved to Potters Bar in 1966, and some 50 years later, with communities growing and under pressure, greater environmental awareness, and more transparent communication via the Internet and social media, commercial organisations are under increasing scrutiny for their actions.

CS Recycling has always and will always endeavour to be a good neighbour. But we recognise we must be more sophisticated in our approach, looking beyond our immediate boundaries and being more proactive in terms of communication.
